Report Details:

- In accordance to New York State Real Property Tax Laws, the Final Rolls for 2024 have been completed and were made available to the public on Monday, July 1st. A newspaper ad was placed in The Post Star on July 2nd stating same. Notices have also been placed on the Town Clerks' and the Assessor's bulletin boards in the Town Hall. The 2024 Final Assessment Rolls can be viewed in either the Town Clerk's or Assessors' offices during business hours. They are also accessible on-line via a link on the Town's website to the Warren County's website where the rolls may be viewed.

- With the 2024 Town-wide Revaluation project concluded, including Board of Assessment grievance hearings, and with the Final Rolls now completed, we can report that the Town's overall Assessed Value increased by approximately 35% and we are now at a 100% Equalization Rate. In numbers, the Town's *overall assessment value* went from \$430,895,434 in 2023 to \$580,533,818, an increase of \$149,638,384 and the Town's *Taxable value* went from \$358,699,973 in 2023 to \$492,239,180 a \$133,539,207 Increase in Taxable Value. [Note: These figures are based on pre small claims cases, which typically are done in August, and are subject to any outcomes from said small claims adjustments]

Attended the meeting with Supervisor Geraghty in Lake Placed and spoke on our Short Term Rental law.

Started reviewing lawns as of June 4, and as of June 10 there were 19 notices mailed out.

Attended the Main Street Grant Meeting.

Town s looking to expand the Main Street Parking.

Attended court with the owner of 3812 Main Street. The owner was restricted to sales from the front porch and the living room, which were not being complied with.

Took and sent current photos of 20 Ridge Ave. to the Town Attorney Peterson. The Town will pursue a court date in NY State Supreme Court for violations of NYS Property Maintenance laws.

Sent a warning notice to the business located at 3915 Main Street for two violations. Parking daily by employees closer than 15 feet to a fire hydrant, and placing a sign in the middle of the sidewalk, blocking the public right of way.

Sent as requested suggested code changes from planning and zoning, along with code enforcement which should be incorporated into the Town Codes.

Sent notice of all issued burning permits to the fire company.

Issued two new Short Term Rental Permits.


Town contractor will start mowing all non-respondent properties as of June 24.

Sent a court notice to the owner of 24 Horicon Ave. for an off premise sign on the property.

Sent additional grass over height notices, to the following properties. 2 Terrace Ave., 18 Prospect Street, 4 Horicon Ave., 143 Library Ave, 6 Burdick Ave. The mailing costs for lawn violations is over \$ 300.00 to the taxpayers who do mow their lawns.

Sent a warning notice to the owner of 28 Sanford Street for brush blocking the sidewalk, public right of way.

PUMP STATION C CALLED OUT FOR HIGH WATER. PUMP 2 WAS BARELY PUMPING. WE BACKFLUSHED THE PUMP AND REMOVED THE DEBRIS.

WE PULLED EACH AIR CHAIN IN CELL 1. THE DIFFUSERS WITH DAMAGED AIR TUBES HAVE BEEN REPLACED WITH NEW ONES. ALSO REPLACING DAMAGED CLAMPS AND HOSES.

WORKED ON PUMP STA B. PUMP 2. WE HAD TO TAKE PUMP 2 APART AND REMOVE THE DEBRIS. THE PUMP WAS PUT BACK TOGETHER AND REPRIMED.

REPLACED THE AIR TUBE IN THE SAND FILTER. THERE WAS A LOT OF FOAM COMING OUT OF THE TUBE AND HARDLY ANY SAND WAS WASHING UP. WE PULLED IT AND FOUND MULTIPLE HOLES BLOWN THROUGH FROM THE SAND. WE REPLACED IT WITH A BRAND NEW ONE AND BROUGHT THE OLD ONE TO ANDERSONS WELDING.

Town of Warrensburg Historian-May 2024 Monthly Report

Attended WHS Monthly meeting, which are held in my office on the 1st Wednesday of every month.

Sarah Farrar continues to come in frequently doing family research.

I continue filing and adding people to the Ancestry program, from the Cindy Needham collection. There is **still** a huge amount to go through.

Char Bivona continues to come in weekly both in my office and the Museum. To help me sort the **humongous** amount of paperwork that I received from the family of Cindy Needham, and to scan photos at the Museum. Much of my time at the Historian's office is spent recording and filing all the information, and at the Museum, entering new Accessions.

Continue clipping newspaper items, and filing them. Anything related to Warrensburg, including Covid of which there, fortunately, is less and less, but I do have about 10 notebooks starting in 2020 of articles. All historians had been asked by the State Historian to record items.

I have started a new file cabinet with Street names and folders for any property that has information and/or photos.

The Historical Society met in my office on June 5th..

Char and I continue adding accessions that were given 2023 into the Past Perfect program at the museum. Every photo is scanned, numbered and added to Past Perfect, and the originals are filed in notebooks. Linda Zila, who will be helping Liz Sebalt was in 2 days. The first day she worked with Liz refolding all the quilts. Last week I showed her how to enter all the items she will be working on and how to add all the information needed for our historical records.

Received an e-mail from Lee Ellis regarding a donation he made to the Museum.

Met with Laura at the Museum to discuss plans and show her how Past Perfect Works.

Wow!!! I would be very happy to receive everything you mentioned. I don't know if I mentioned it in my previous email, but when I started 20 years ago there were three file cabinets, but there were only a total of two drawers used. One had photos (with no names) and the other had 3 sets of file folders, 1800, 1900, 2000 - all three had legal size folders A-Z with sheets that had info pasted on both sides. As an example the A folder in the 1800's had 3 obits for different people on one side, and 2 on the other side plus an article about a business which started with the letter A. Each folder had about 3 or 4 sheets with similar items. All were in the 1800's but none in he same year! It took me my first year to copy all, cut and put in appropriate folders. I now have 22 drawers for people and 4 drawers for businesses, along with individual notebooks for families whose folders were more than an 1" thick.

I read Lee's obit. She was born the same day as my husband Steve Parisi, but died almost 2 years later than he did, 12/20/2020. He had been the Director of the Warensburgh Museum.

Anyway, I ramble, but look forward to whatever you send. If you ever get out this way, I would love to meet you and show you what I have and our Museum.

I'm impressed with all the genealogy stuff you do. I can add to that, - if you want.

One thing you might be interested in is a binder I've put together for us Matsons, specifically on Johnny Ellis & what he managed to do in Northern, CA. I've attached some pictures. The first picture is the "cover" of that binder. I need to add some more material to it. Since I've made a couple extra ones, I'll be glad to donate & send it to you. (It can be placed on your library shelf & will be an interesting read). Hopefully, you can enlarge the picture enough to read on your computer.

The next picture (colorized) is of Johnny & Lee in the cabin they lived in up at Donner Summit. You can see through the window a portion of his surveying instrument that he scoped out his ski runs.

The next picture is Lee's WBHS class ring. I've included her obituary for you to read. The next picture is of Lee & I. She died [from Multiple Myeloma, a kind of blood cell cancer] about 3 weeks after the picture was taken. The one beside it was taken of her in her first year at Wheaton (1957 or 1958). She retained her attractiveness right up until she died.

That last picture is the plaque that was given to Evelyn at a ceremony at Donner Summit to honor Johnny's contributions to skiing there.

That binder will have a lot of anecdotal, humorous comments like Johnny carrying dynamite in his back pocket to blast rock out of the mountainside!

I better close for now. I'll try calling you at home this evening.

Community Garden

Our Community Garden Coordinators Bob Bradley and Tom O’Dea have been communicating with our plot owners and making sure that they understand the responsibility of owning one or multiple plots, keeping the plots as weed free as possible, and hopefully weeding the paths around their plots. All of the plots have been adopted. Bob assembled a new tool shed purchased with grant funding through WCSWCD. We had two large strawberry plants donated to Beautification, so another raised bed dedicated to strawberries will be built once again using local hemlock. Thanks to Tracy and his crew, the water tank has been refilled as needed and with the sunshine and nutrient rich soil the plants are thriving!

Strawberry Festival

Our Second Annual Strawberry Festival on June 21st was a huge success! Thank you to all those who donated dishes for our Sampling Table, to our community and visitors who came out despite the rain, and our vendors who make the event possible. Even though the strawberry crop came early this year we had a limited supply. People came, sampled strawberry recipes, listened to live music, had a free cup of coffee and shopped with our local businesses. Cornell Cooperative Extension recipes were distributed at our Master Gardener Station as well as horticultural information on how to grow your own. Strawberry themed crafts for the children were provided by Richards Library, and our vendors picked up on the theme as well.

Once again, a big "Thank You" to the Town of Warrensburg for offering us the Recreation Field Pavilion for our festivals and rainy market days. The rain came down, the customers came out and we were all dry! Just a note, no other farmers' market in Warren County besides Glen Falls has a large pavilion, so rain or shine you can count on the [Warrensburgh Riverfront Farmers' Market](#) every Friday from 3-6 p.m. from the first Friday in June to the second Friday in October.
