Local Law No. 3 of the year 2019

A local law Amending §141-16.1 (Individual Participant Permits) of the Code of the Town of Warrensburg

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the

Town of Warrensburg as follows:

Section I. Substantive Law. Section 141-16.1(B) of Chapter 141 of the Code of the Town of Warrensburg is replaced in its entirety by the following language:

Every applicant for an Individual Participant Permit ("IPP") for a major event as defined in Article I §141-1 and Article II §141-13, shall submit to the Town Clerk a sworn application setting forth the information required on an application form approved by the Town Board. The IPP Permit shall restrict the seller/vendor to the stated major event, and mandate that the IPP Permit may not be used in lieu of a permit or license issued under Article I of this Chapter.

Section II. Supersession: This local law is hereby adopted pursuant to the provision of §10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law and §10 of the New York State Statute of Local Governments, it being the intent of the Town Board to supersede any and all contrary or inconsistent State Laws.

Section III. Inconsistency: All other local laws and ordinances of the Town of Warrensburg, if any, that are inconsistent with the provisions of this local law are hereby repealed: provided, however, that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this local law shall be in addition to such other local laws or ordinances, if any, regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this local law.

Section IV. Savings Clause: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment, order and/or decision shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation of the clause, sentence, paragraph, worked section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section V. Effective Date: This local law shall take place immediately upon its filing with the New York State Secretary of State.
